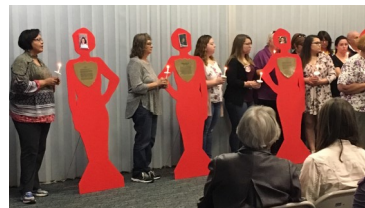

MESSAGE FROM LEADERSHIP

Dear Friends and Supporters:

With the help of a dedicated Board of Directors and a competent, professional staff, DVSCP has accomplished a lot in the past year. We continue to be grateful for the incredible support we receive from the community in so many ways.

The Annual Sunflower Gala, and its strong committee led by Jodi Bezanilla, raised over \$53,000! Mistress of Ceremonies Alicia Richards added a lot of heart to the event, and attendees really loved the Photo Booth! We offered online bidding for the first time, and competition got pretty fierce. Thanks to all of the corporate sponsors and to everyone who came and enjoyed the evening.

Given everything that happened in the country last year, particularly around the lives of women, DVSCP decided to revise our Annual 'Walk a Mile in Her Shoes' event to a Men's Solidarity March. Over 50 men of all ages walked silently in the Camp Hill Memorial Day Parade wearing t-shirts that said, 'No More.' It was a powerful message, demonstrating how men are allies in the violence against women movement. Special thanks to Dan Piscioneri for leading this effort.

At the Annual Victims' Rights Rally, which DVSCP does in collaboration with YWCA Carlisle's Sexual Assault/Rape Crisis Services of Cumberland County and the Victim Services Division of the District Attorney's Office, DVSCP named Jim Hoefler our 'Volunteer of the Year.' Jim has spent countless hours improving the Shelter, from tearing up old carpet, to renovating a bathroom, to repainting staff offices, to coming in to deal with any number of repairs. All at no charge to the agency.

On a very sad note, we said goodbye to Randy Runkle, the agency's Business Manager for over 15 years. Randy passed away unexpectedly in March, leaving all of us in shock. Randy left quite a legacy at DVSCP – everyone we talked to sang his praises, noted how easy he was to work with, and expressed their deep sorrow that he is no longer with us.

The agency held its Annual Meeting in May at the Carlisle Country Club, honoring the Founding Mothers of DVSCP. Many of the women were in attendance, and Bonnie Fowler, Founding Mother and first Executive Director, gave a memorable speech, looking back to those early days and reminding the audience about how much is still to be done. It was a wonderful way to end our year, looking back at the grit and determination it took to bring this agency to life, and looking forward to the work that still needs to be done.

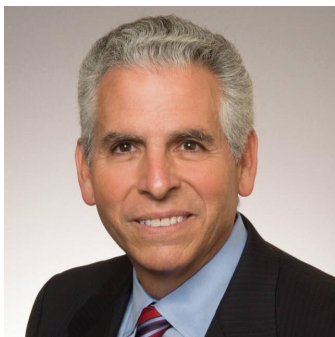

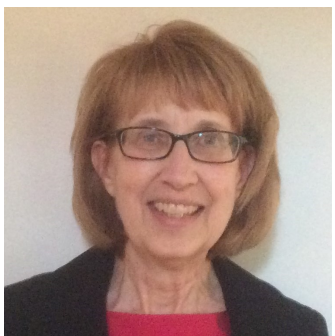

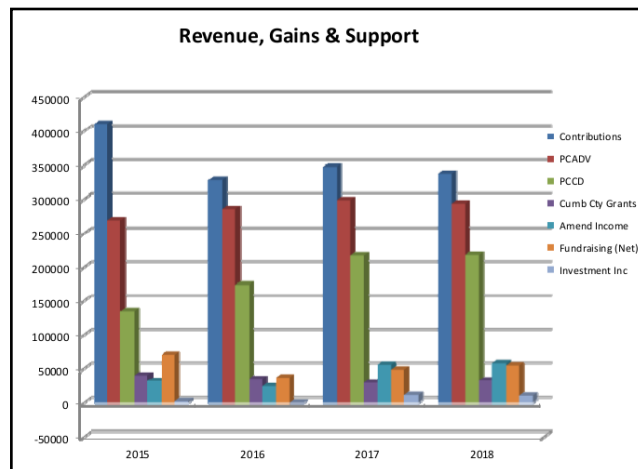

YEAR IN REVIEW

2018 Sunflower Gala

The 2018 Sunflower Gala made DVSCP history, raising more than \$53,000 for the agency. Held on Saturday, March 17, over 250 guests from all over Cumberland and Perry Counties enjoyed dinner and drinks at the West Shore Country Club. The night was filled with delicious food, dancing and, of course, the silent auction.

The agency took a chance this year on a mobile bidding app for the Gala's silent auction. This enabled guests to bid directly through their smart phones or iPads—getting instant notifications when they were outbid. Because we opened the bidding before the event started, competitive juices were already flowing when the evening began! Attendees also enjoyed piling in the Photo Booth with friends and family for some silly photos to mark the occasion.

Alicia Richards of ABC 27 News emceed the evening and spoke of her experience covering domestic violence stories throughout the Mid State. Higashi Jewelry & Eyewear donated a beautiful diamond and gold necklace, which we raffled off at the Gala, bringing in more than \$1,500 towards the final tally. Judging by the photos, the excitement over the mobile bidding app, and the dancing—we are confident the evening was a huge success!

YEAR IN REVIEW

Walk of Solidarity

The famous quote, 'Be the Change you Wish to See in the World,' rang true at DVSCP's first ever Walk of Solidarity. Held in conjunction with the Camp Hill Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 28, nearly 50 men and boys joined the agency behind the DVSCP banner, all wearing T-shirts with the slogan 'No More' to walk in silence in the parade.

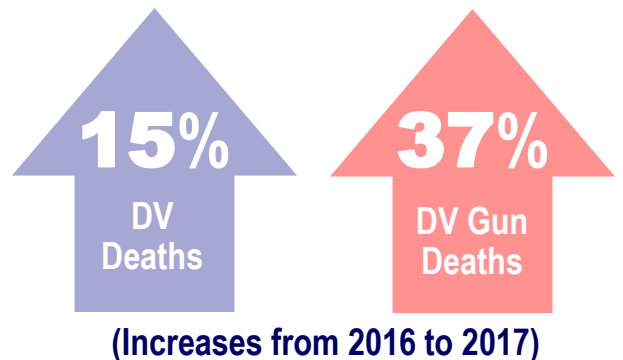
DVSCP wanted an event that would help shift the responsibility to deter harm away from women by asking men to promote healthy masculinity. The Walk made a powerful statement that men are deeply involved and will no longer tolerate violence of any kind. The group received positive feedback from the crowd with a lot of onlookers clapping, standing and shouting out 'thank you' as the men walked past. Participants also raised more than \$1,600 for the agency!

What started as an idea to raise awareness and engage men in the fight against domestic violence became a well received message.

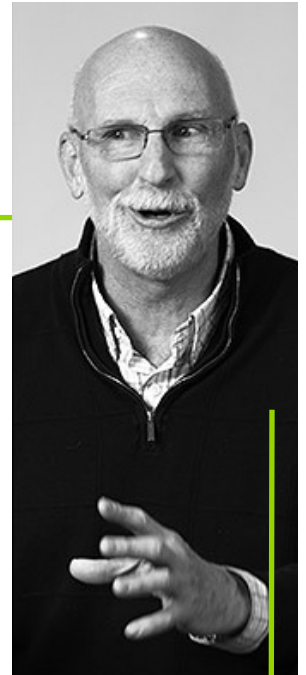

ADVOCACY EFFORTS

Because nothing can truly change without the legal system supporting victim rights, DVSCP created an Advocacy Committee in 2017. The committee is made up Board and Staff members with the collective goal of educating and urging legislators to introduce and vote for laws that support survivors and victims of domestic violence and sexual assault.

This year, the committee attended rallies, made phone calls, and worked to educate others on several new pieces of legislation. Through Advocacy Day at the State Capitol on April 30, members were able to meet with our Senators and State Representatives to discuss two specific pieces of legislation: SB 501—The Common Sense Bill, and SB1011, also known as Marsy's Law.

Our advocacy efforts paid off as SB 501, now House Bill 2060, passed the House and State Senate in October 2018. The amended Bill calls for the removal of friends and family as third-party safe keepers of firearms for those served with a final Protection From Abuse order (PFA). The bill also proposes to decrease the time in which the accused has to turn in those weapons from 60 days to 24 hours. House Bill 2060 was just signed into law by Governor Tom Wolf. Great news for domestic violence survivors in Pennsylvania!



Marsy's Law proposes to amend the state Constitution to bring crime victims' rights on the same level as the defendants' rights. Pennsylvania is currently only 1 of 15 states whose Constitution doesn't address victims' rights. While this Bill is still up for vote, advocates and law makers alike are positive this will pass soon.

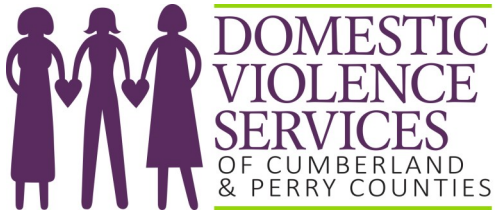
